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

This week Year 4 have been busy preparing for our key stage 2 Harvest service at St John's church tomorrow. We're all looking forward to being back at church together and sharing in communion.




Reception Plea

Attendance at Deanery

Your child is required to attend school for 190 days each year. The government target for attendance in primary schools is at least 95%.





Thank you for attending the recent curriculum evenings. We always listen to your feedback and value your thoughts on how we can make things better.

Here are some of the comments and our actions:

'Details of class timetables would be useful.' All timetables are available on the year group Google Classroom.

'We enjoy getting feedback and seeing photos, could we have a year group newsletter?' All year groups have a blog – available on the school website, where photographs of learning are shared.

'How can parents help with prosody?' A guide is printed at the back of every book - this is available for parents to view on every Collins ebook at the end. At school, we model prosody and say to the children 'copy me.' They would then take a turn. We would discuss any relevant punctuation, such as an exclamation mark, and discuss how this would change our voices, e.g. louder, more excited.

'It is difficult to see a double page spread on an ebook, when reading on an ipad.' With regards to the double spread not being visible online, this is down to the device it is being opened on and not something we can change unfortunately. For example, on a laptop or desktop computer, the book is visible as a double page spread, but not on an iphone/ipad.

'It would be interesting to have an overview of other areas of the curriculum.' The programmes of study for each term are shared on the school's website. This details all of the learning that the children will cover during the term. There are subject overviews, also available on the website, which shows the progressions on learning and the areas of study covered for the whole school.

If you have any other questions, that have not been answered, please share them with the class teachers and they would be very happy to help.

Message from Walmley Social Club
