Subject Vision - Early Years

Intent
<p>We believe that play underpins the delivery of the EYFS and that children learn best through practical, hands-on experiences and interactions with their environment.</p> <p>Our children achieve the best outcomes when within their day there is a mixture of child-initiated play, actively supported by adults and focused learning, with adults guiding the learning through playful, rich and experiential activities.</p> <p>The quality of the learning environment both indoor and outdoor ensures children access the highest quality of provision and experience.</p> <p>We ensure all pupils of all starting the points have a curriculum that meets their needs by providing a well-balanced and broad curriculum that builds on children's interests and lays the building blocks for future learning – prepared for the next steps in their learning journey.</p>
Implementation
<p>We provide children with opportunities to consolidate and extend skills and concepts learned. Impact
<p>By providing a safe, secure, happy environment in the Early Years in which children are stimulated and their needs are met, children are deeply engaged, highly motivated and eager to join in. They are able to share and cooperate well and be confident, independent learners. They will have a broad curriculum that exposes children to new learning and ideas and supports children in asking questions and finding out about the world. They will have a love of reading with a wide vocabulary and be ready for the next steps of learning.</p>
