

We come to the end of a very busy half term.


It won't have escaped your notice that work on the new adventure playground is underway again. This has created a lot of excitement amongst the children — and parents alike!


We hope that it will be operational when we return to school, however, we will be introducing it to the children after the final safety inspection, so request that it is not used before or after school, until then.

Phase News

In Nursery the focus has been 'Our Home Sweet Home!' The children have brought in photographs of their houses and talked about them, discussing features inside and outside and things they can see out of their window! They have been building their own houses using bricks and blocks, talking about what they want them to look like and planning how they can build them.

Reception have been learning about 'maps' after reading 'Me on the map' by Joan Sweeney. They have been making maps of the classroom and outside area. Children have also been using language to compare quantities focusing on the words such as 'more than' and 'fewer than'.

In English Year 1 have started a new writing unit based on 'The Snail and the Whale.' They have been learning about how a postcard is constructed and using interesting vocabulary to describe the places the Snail and the Whale have visited. In Maths they have continued to develop our understanding of number bonds to 10 and the different ways we can represent them.

It has been a busy half term settling into our new year groups and we are proud at how well children have transitioned.

Year 2 and 3 had a wonderful week last week celebrating all things elephant in honour of St Giles Hospice. They designed their own artwork for our Deanery elephant, learnt about how animals are respected in different faiths and created their own elephant to sell at Parents' Evening.

Mia 5H – "I loved all the elephant work and showing my creative side."


Sebastian 5H - "It was great fun making the elephant and I enjoyed the lessons about elephants."





Do you know where I can get some health advice?

The School Health Support Service can help students with all kind of things like...

Relationships, mental health, alcohol, bullying, self-harm, smoking, drugs and healthy eating



We do not usually inform your parents, teachers or anyone else if you contact the school nurse. We might inform someone if we were concerned about your safety, but we would usually speak to you first. Your messages are stored and can be seen by other healthcare staff who follow the same confidentiality rules. We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate bounce-back to confirm we received your text. Texts will not be seen outside of normal working hours. If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting STOP to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at your usual rate.

'We are a friendly and informal community choir, open to new membership. We rehearse on Tuesdays 7-9pm at Sutton Coldfield Rugby Club, Walmley Road in the upstairs function room of the clubhouse.

You would be very welcome to come along and see if you like us and the music we are working on. You can join in for a couple of trial sessions, you will have a loan set of music while there. We do not hold auditions. You do not have to be able to read music either. If you are unsure about which voice group you are you can take your time to find out. You will be assigned an established member as a 'buddy' to guide you through things if needed. Our subs are currently £150 per year (academic calendar) with various payment options.

We organise some optional extra social events during the year, including a monthly Quiz Night, meals out and a Christmas Party.

We nominate a local charity each year, funds raised at concerts, a monthly raffle and regular Quiz Night are given to the charity.'

For anyone who decides to join there is a little bit of paperwork and a payment either £150 annually, £12.50 monthly or £50 each term. We rehearse during school terms (roughly).

Krzys Weber our conductor hosts our monthly Quiz Night. The proceeds go to our nominated charity. The next quiz is on Friday 3rd November. It is usually held on the first Friday of each month, but occasionally changes. This is open to anyone, not just choir members. We use Sutton Town Football Club function room, Coles Lane, Sutton Coldfield, B72 1NL. It is a fun quiz including rounds such as 'in the news this week' 'music' 'wipeout' and 'connections'. There are prizes plus a bonus 'backwards bingo' game. The fully licensed bar is open. People can come as a team or join an existing team, it cost £2 per person plus an optional extra of £1 each for backwards bingo. No need to book, just turn up anytime after 7.30pm for an 8pm start. I post reminders about this on our Facebook page.

Our charity for this year, as you probably know is Edward's Trust. So far we have 2 Christmas concerts planned, there may be more once arrangements are finalised. We will be singing at St Peter's Church, Drayton Bassett on Saturday 25th November, in the evening. There is no entry fee, a collection and raffle will be held. On Saturday 9th December we have our concert at St Michael's Church, Boldmere. Tickets will be sold for this. When all arrangements are confirmed and we have publicity material I will forward copies to you.
