Parking reminders


I have received a couple of concerns raised by members of our school community regarding the way some parents are parking during pick up and drop off times.

Phase News

In Nursery the children have had a visit from a doctor, vet and midwife to learn how these people help others around them. The children listened carefully and were introduced to lots of new vocabulary.

Reception have been looking at the celebration of birthdays this week. We have been making cards, decorating balloons and counting candles. It has been lovely to hear all about children's experiences of birthdays.

Year 1 have been naming and describing 2D and 3D shapes. They have used their geographical skills to recognise areas around school.

All year groups have been practising their lines and singing their Nativity songs and are very excited to be performing next week!


We do hope you are able to attend and we look forward to meeting you and sharing our Christmas wishes with you all.

Deanery Christmas Post Box




The Deanery Christmas Post-box is back!

We have had lots of shoe boxes brought into school we feel this is a lovely way for the children to show kindness and generosity for those less fortunate than themselves.


The delivery driver stated he had never collected so many boxes from a school, which is fabulous!


There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about managing specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't.


RNIB Stamps Appeal


As a school, we would like to support RNIB this festive season and collect stamps to make a difference to blind and partially sighted people.

We do not usually inform your parents, teachers or anyone else if you contact the school nurse. We might inform someone if we were concerned about your safety, but we would usually speak to you first. Your messages are stored and can be seen by other healthcare staff who follow the same confidentiality rules. We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate bounce-back to confirm we received your text. Texts will not be seen outside of normal working hours. If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting **STOP** to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at zour sub you gate.
