

#### **Attendance Focus**



As you know, at Deanery, children who miss time from school due to holidays or trips and visits, will not have this time off school authorised. More importantly, the lessons and learning they miss really put them at a disadvantage. The curriculum builds successively on prior learning and children who are absent from school will have gaps in their knowledge and skills and will not be able to build on, or apply this sequential knowledge. Statistics show that children with good attendance have higher attainment in school and studies show that children with attendance above 96% make better progress socially and academically.

Our current whole school attendance is 95.3%.


When children have 19 days off school, this could be due to a holiday accompanied by an illness, they will be classed as a persistent absentee for the whole academic year as they will be unable to increase their attendance to above 90%.


Our aim is to improve whole school attendance to above 97% and request that all families endeavour to support us.

#### Phase News

Nursery have been creating butterflies and looking at how their wings are symmetrical. Children have also been creating under the sea worlds as part of their art project this half term.

Reception have been learning how to read longer words in phonics. They have been reading the Julia Donaldson story, 'The Snail and the Whale' looking at the different environments and being introduced to different vocabulary. They had an excellent walk through Jones' wood last week after reading 'The Gruffalo'. Luckily we didn't meet the Gruffalo on our walk.

Year 1 have been spotting patterns in numbers, and identifying odd and even numbers. In Science they have been classifying animals and discussing their features.

Year 2 have been producing some super sentences in writing including powerful verbs to describe the weather.

Year 3 have been working hard using their understanding of times tables to help them with division.

Years 4, 5 and 6 - Over the last week, the children have thoroughly enjoyed going out into the community to deliver handwritten postcards to people's homes. The children thought carefully about the positive messages and well wishes they wanted to share with our neighbours to hopefully bring smiles and joy to others. It has been wonderful receiving such positive feedback from members of the community, so thank you and we are glad we brought happiness and joy to your days!


#### Success at the British Schools Gymnastics Competition!!!

We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps.) Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting STOP to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at your usual rate.
