Parking


Over recent weeks, some members of our school community have been parking in a way that is dangerous to children, pedestrians and other road users. Cars have been parked on the white zig-zag lines outside of school. This action prevents the view of the zebra crossing causing an obvious safety hazard for pedestrians. The Highway Code details that:

'You MUST NOT park on a crossing or in the area covered by zig-zag lines.'



In addition, vehicles have completely blocked the entrance to the coach park, preventing access to the school by returning coaches or emergency vehicles.

Children across the school have taken part in our Easter Bunny Hop -


We are supporting 3 charities this term as chosen by the children- Jericho (a local charity), St Mungo's (a national charity) and Christian Aid (an international charity).





Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting **STOP** to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at your usual rate.






